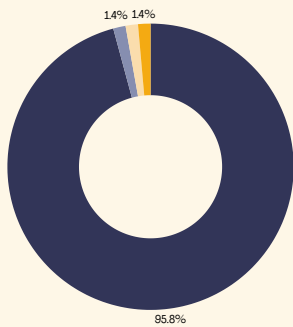
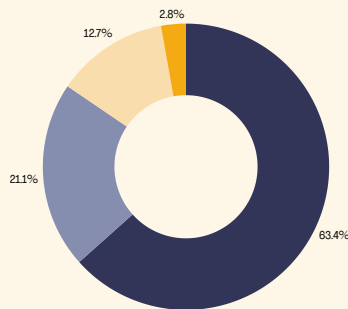

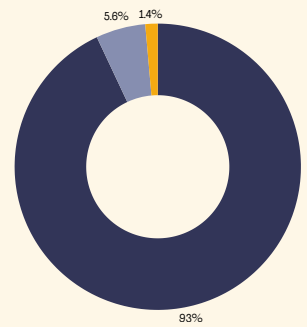

Inspired Generosity: Atlanta was the premier of the showcase. It was set up in the historic Auburn Avenue Research Library, and featured 50 diverse stories of generosity from the Muslim community.

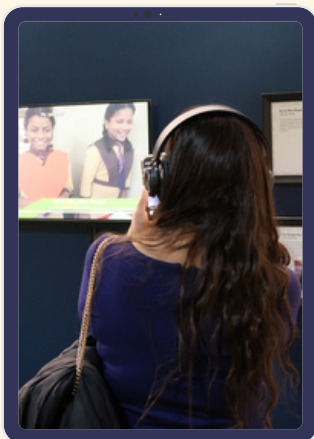
